**LODGING**

**SEASONAL CABINS:** We have a total of 6 rustic cabins with a capacity to sleep 18 people each. Cabins are not heated, but have electricity, restrooms, and showers. Total capacity is 108. Whole cabins can be rented for \$100/night or you can choose to rent a bed in a single gendered cabin for \$10/night.

**YEAR ROUND CABINS:** We have 2 cabins that are year round and can sleep up to 24 total. Each side is completely separated from the other and can hold 12 with it's own bathroom. These cabins have a large screened in porch that both sides share. To be completed mid-May.

**MOUNTAIN VIEW LODGE:** A large newly constructed house that sleeps up to 30. It has 8 bedrooms that have different configurations of bunk beds, 5 bathrooms, a spacious kitchen and living room area. The large wrap around deck has a grill, picnic tables and several rocking chairs for admiring the beautiful mountain view. Rooms in the Lodge are \$50/night and bathrooms may be shared with other families.

**TENT CAMPING:** Tent space is available on our recreation field.

## Rules for Rental Groups of the Swannanoa 4-H Educational Center

Groups using the facilities at the 4-H Center are responsible for adhering to the following guide lines:

1. If a reservation is cancelled, or the number is decreased, the director must be notified 30 days prior to the scheduled event. If not, the group is responsible for paying 80% of the contracted service. Deposits are forfeited if cancellation occurs less than 90 days prior to the scheduled event. No reservation is confirmed and binding without deposit.
2. The person listed on the reservation request form as the person in charge, must arrive in advance of the group to register with the Director or Center Representative. A walk through of facilities will be conducted to affirm the arrangements have been fulfilled. The person in charge is also responsible for registering and orienting the group upon arrival and for the conduct of the group.
3. A charge will be assessed for the breakage, damage, or loss of Center owned equipment or facilities (unless determined to be normal wear). Groups are responsible for leaving the Center in order and removing all equipment or supplies brought in by individuals of the group and lost or left.
4. The rental group must have a nationally recognized, certified lifeguard with age appropriate breathing device training in CPR for all swimming activities. There must be a minimum of one lifeguard for every 25 people participating. The Center may be able to supply lifeguard staff, if available, for an additional charge.
  - a. Lifeguards must be within the fenced area of the pool during pool swimming. If the lifeguard leaves the pool area, the area must be cleared of people and locked.
  - b. The Director, Property Manager or other Center Staff may shut down the pool if they witness activity they consider to be unsafe.
5. Team building and high ropes courses and climbing wall are off limits to guests of the Center unless under the supervision of the Center's program staff.
6. Guests are not allowed to bring pets to the Center.
7. Parking is permitted in the main parking lot by the lodge as well as by the lower field area.
8. Alcohol, Drugs and illegal activities are prohibited on the premises. Smoking is not allowed in any Center Buildings. Smoking is only allowed in the patio area behind the Lodge. Smoking is not allowed in any public area while youth groups are on site. Alcohol may be considered for a function if discussed with administration prior to arrival.
9. Firearms and other weapons, ammunition, explosives, and fireworks are prohibited on the Center property.
10. The Center may serve multiple groups at the same time. Please be sure to clearly Communicate to your group which buildings are rented for their use. Other buildings on the Center are off limits.
11. The Center main number (828) 686-3196 and can be used for contacting guests from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm. Messages will be taken and an attempt will be made to deliver these messages to the person in charge of the group. If this individual or their designee cannot be located, messages will be posted in the dining hall on the bulletin board. After 4:30 pm messages can be left on the voice mail. Messages will be delivered at breakfast unless they are truly emergencies. The after hour emergency contact number is (828) 686-4838. If additional contact is needed for your group, we recommend that the person in charge arrange for a cellular telephone to be brought.
12. The Center quiet times are from 11:00 pm to 6:30 am. Groups are expected to be in their cabins or in their Group's designated buildings. Noise levels must be maintained such that they cannot be heard outside the buildings.

13. Youth groups must be supervised according to the following ages and ratios of staff to youth:  
4-5 yrs. is 1/5, 6-8 yrs. is 1/6, 9-14 yrs. is 1/8 and 15-18 yrs. is 1/10.
14. Groups are responsible for their own first aid needs and emergency transportation. Groups are required to have their own CPR and First Aid trained personnel. Such persons should be trained in age appropriate CPR breathing device use and blood pathogens from a nationally recognized provider. If you need additional assistance please contact the office staff. The Center has 911 service, which can be contacted 24 hours a day from the phone just inside the Lodge. Groups are required to file an Incident Report for any injuries or illnesses requiring outside medical assistance resulting from or while on residence at the Center.
15. Youth groups are required to have the following for their participants, emergency contact information to include names and phone numbers, current health history which includes current health conditions, allergies, medications or special restrictions. All youth group participants must have signed permission to seek emergency treatment for minors.
16. The Center Director's house is a private residence. Entry except in the case of an emergency is not allowed. In case of an emergency, if there is no one in the office, please contact the Center Director at 828-686-3196.
